The certificates of insurance on file for Hubert Jefferson Burrill, trading as Burrill's Wheelchair Transportation Services (B.W.T.), were cancelled effective 12:01 a.m. on January 11, 2002, triggering the invalidation and automatic suspension of Certificate No. 564 under Article XI, Section 7(g), of the Compact and Commission Regulation No. 58-02.

The Commission issued Order No. 6489 that same day and therein directed respondent to file an appropriate certificate of insurance within 30 days or show cause why Certificate No. 564 should not be revoked.

On January 23, 2002, respondent filed an application requesting voluntary termination of Certificate No. 564.

The Commission may terminate a certificate of authority under Title II of the Compact, Article XI, Section 10(b), upon application by the holder.


The application shall be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That Certificate of Authority No. 564 is hereby terminated, effective this date.
2. That within 30 days from the date of this order applicant shall:
 - a. remove from applicant's vehicle(s) the identification placed thereon pursuant to Commission Regulation No. 61;
 - b. file a notarized affidavit with the Commission verifying compliance with the preceding requirement; and

c. surrender Certificate No. 564 to the Commission.
