By application accepted for filing April 15, 2002, applicant, BMG Limousine and Jet Service, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company, seeks Commission approval to acquire Certificate No. 515 from OAO Corporation, trading as BMG Limousine Service.

Applicant is controlled by Cecile D. Barker, who at one time controlled OAO.

Applicant proposes commencing operations with four sedans and six limousines. Applicant's proposed tariff contains transfer rates and hourly charter rates, with minimum charges, as well as per capita rates for airports and train stations.

Under Article XI, Section 11(a), of the Compact, a person may not transfer a certificate of authority unless the Commission approves the transfer as consistent with the public interest. The public interest analysis focuses on the transferee's fitness, the resulting competitive balance and the interests of affected employees.¹

This proceeding is hereby initiated to determine whether applicant is fit.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:


1. That applicant shall publish once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District, no later than May 28, 2002, notice in the form prescribed by the staff of the Commission.

2. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than June 18, 2002, an original and four copies of an affidavit that notice has been published as required in the preceding paragraph.

3. That the deadline for filing protests, comments, applications for intervention, and requests for formal hearing, is June 18, 2002, and that copies must be served on applicant's attorney, Dana C.
