By application filed August 6, 2002, General Services, Inc., a District of Columbia corporation trading as General Services Family Transport, seeks a certificate of authority for irregular route operations in vehicles with a seating capacity of less than 16 persons only, including the driver.

Applicant proposes commencing operations with three vans. Applicant's proposed tariff contains rates for transportation under the DC Medicaid program.

Applicant's balance sheet, Exhibit A, shows only \$616 in cash and no revenue vehicles. Pursuant to Commission Regulation No. 54-04(c), applicant will be directed to explain how it proposes to obtain and insure three vans, pay other start-up costs and establish a sufficient reserve for contingencies with only \$616.

This proceeding is hereby initiated to determine whether applicant is fit and whether the proposed transportation is consistent with the public interest.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:


1. That applicant shall publish once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District, no later than September 12, 2002, notice in the form prescribed by the staff of the Commission.

2. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than October 3, 2002, an original and four copies of an affidavit that notice has been published as required in the preceding paragraph.

3. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than September 12, 2002, an original and four copies of a written statement that explains how applicant proposes to obtain and insure three vans, pay other start-up costs and establish a sufficient reserve for contingencies with only \$616.

4. That the deadline for filing protests, comments, applications for intervention, and requests for formal hearing, is October 3, 2002, and that copies must be served on applicant's president, Ms. Monreti Akinleye, 3613 Georgia Avenue, N.W., Washington, DC 20010.
