The certificates of insurance on file for JAR Enterprises, Inc., trading as Golden Touch Limousine, expired February 1, 2002, triggering the invalidation and automatic suspension of Certificate No. 281 under Article XI, Section 7(g), of the Compact and Commission Regulation No. 58-02. Order No. 6521, issued on February 5, 2002, directed JAR Enterprises to file effective insurance certificates within thirty days or show good cause why its certificate of authority should not be revoked.

On March 12, 2002, JAR Enterprises filed an application to delete the trade name "Golden Touch Limousine" from Certificate No. 281 in order to facilitate the issuance of a certificate of insurance. The application was conditionally granted on March 20, 2002, in Order No. 6575. The reissuance of Certificate No. 281 was expressly made contingent on applicant filing additional documents within thirty days, including one or more insurance certificates without the "Golden Touch Limousine" trade name, current vehicle safety inspection certificates for all revenue vehicles, and an affidavit verifying that the "Golden Touch Limousine" trade name has been removed from the exterior of applicant's revenue vehicles. Order No. 6575 further provided that upon applicant's failure to timely

satisfy the conditions of reissuance, the application would stand denied and Certificate of Authority No. 281 would be subject to immediate revocation without further proceedings.

Applicant filed the required insurance certificates within thirty days, but applicant has yet to file any current vehicle safety inspection certificates, any affidavit of trade name removal, or any of the other documents required by Order No. 6575.

It has now been more than 180 days since Order No. 6575 was issued. Under Regulation No. 66, 180 days is the maximum time allowed for submitting documents in response to an order conditionally approving an application to amend a certificate of authority.


Accordingly, Certificate of Authority No. 281 shall be revoked pursuant to Article XI, Section 10(c), of the Compact for the willful failure of JAR Enterprises to comply with Commission Order No. 6575.

Case Nos. MP-2002-60 and MP-2002-77, concerning the failure of JAR Enterprises to file an annual report for 2001 and pay the annual fee for 2002, shall be terminated, provided that in the event Certificate No. 281 is later reinstated the requirement to file an annual report for 2001, pay the \$100 annual fee for 2002, and pay the combined \$200 civil forfeiture assessed in Order Nos. 6777 and 6778 likewise shall stand reinstated.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That Certificate of Authority No. 281 is hereby revoked.
2. That within 30 days from the date of this order respondent shall:
 - a. remove from respondent's vehicle(s) the identification placed thereon pursuant to Commission Regulation No. 61;
 - b. file a notarized affidavit with the Commission verifying compliance with the preceding paragraph; and
 - c. surrender Certificate No. 281 to the Commission.
3. That Case Nos. MP-2002-60 and MP-2002-77 are hereby terminated.
