By application accepted for filing September 5, 2003, Abdul Aziz Jallow, a sole proprietor trading as Right Way Transportation, seeks a certificate of authority for irregular route operations in vehicles with a seating capacity of less than 16 persons only, including the driver.

Applicant proposes commencing operations with three vans. Applicant's proposed tariff contains rates for transportation to Ronald Reagan Washington National and Washington-Dulles International Airports and rates for transportation under the DC Medicaid program.

According to Commission records, applicant was one of the owners of ACEP Group Incorporated at the time it held Certificate No. 548. ~~The Commission revoked Certificate No. 548 and assessed a \$2,500 civil forfeiture against ACEP earlier this year for knowingly and willfully violating the Compact by operating while suspended and uninsured.~~¹ ACEP paid \$1,000 on April 3, 2003, but still owes \$1,500. Applicant will be directed to file a notarized statement explaining why the Commission should find applicant fit as to regulatory compliance given applicant's history of regulatory violations and why the Commission should approve this application as consistent with the public interest given ACEP's unpaid forfeiture of \$1,500.

This proceeding is hereby initiated to determine whether applicant is fit and whether the proposed transportation is consistent with the public interest.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That applicant shall publish once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District, no later than October 17, 2003, notice in the form prescribed by the staff of the Commission.

2. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than November 7, 2003, an original and four copies of an affidavit that notice has been published as required in the preceding paragraph.


3. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than October 17, 2003, an original and four copies of a notarized statement explaining why the Commission should find applicant fit as

to regulatory compliance given applicant's history of regulatory violations and why the Commission should approve this application as consistent with the public interest given ACEP's unpaid forfeiture of \$1,500.

4. That the deadline for filing protests, comments, applications for intervention, and requests for formal hearing, is November 7, 2003, and that copies must be served on applicant at 5925 Clay Street, N.E., Washington, DC 20019.
