By application accepted for filing February 25, 2005, applicant, U.S. One Transportation, LLC, a Maryland limited liability company trading as U.S. One Transcare, seeks Commission approval to acquire Certificate No. 684 from Modupe Ayodeji Atanda-Owo, trading as US One Transportation. Atanda-Owo has agreed to transfer Certificate No. 684 and other assets in exchange for a controlling interest in U.S. One Transportation, LLC, a new carrier.

Applicant proposes commencing operations with eight sedans and six vans. Applicant's Exhibit A omits two vehicles listed in Ms. Atanda-Owo's 2004 annual report, filed February 10, 2005. Applicant will be directed to file an amended Exhibit A that includes Ms. Atanda-Owo's vehicle nos. US1 and US2 or a statement explaining why those vehicles have been omitted from this application.

Applicant's proposed tariff refers to an expired contract between Ms. Atanda-Owo and LogistiCare Solutions, LLC, WMATC Carrier No. 524. In addition, applicant has not submitted any airport shuttle rates even though Ms. Atanda-Owo's current tariff includes such rates. Applicant will be directed to file an amended Exhibit B that includes a copy of Ms. Atanda-Owo's current LogistiCare contract and any airport shuttle rates applicant intends to charge.

Under Article XI, Section 11(a), of the Compact, a person may not transfer a certificate of authority unless the Commission approves the transfer as consistent with the public interest. The public interest analysis focuses on the acquiring party's fitness.<sup>1</sup>

This proceeding is hereby initiated to determine whether applicant is fit.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That applicant shall publish once in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District, no later than April 18, 2005, notice in the form prescribed by the staff of the Commission.

2. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than May 2, 2005, an original and four copies of an affidavit that notice has been published as required in the preceding paragraph.

3. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than May 2, 2005, an amended Exhibit A that includes Ms. Atanda-Owo's vehicle nos. US1 and US2 or a statement explaining why those vehicles have been omitted from this application.

4. That applicant shall file with the Commission, no later than May 2, 2005, an amended Exhibit B that includes a copy of Ms. Atanda-Owo's current LogistiCare contract and any airport shuttle rates applicant intends to charge.

5. That the deadline for filing protests, comments, applications for intervention, and requests for formal hearing, is May 2, 2005, and that copies must be served on applicant's representative, Ganiyu Olatunde Atanda-Owo, 3022 Mitchellville Road, Bowie, MD 20716.
