By email dated June 21, 2018, applicant was notified of acceptance of its application for a certificate of authority and directed to furnish within 14 days either: (1) proof that the trade name "OAC Enterprises" has been inactivated or transferred to applicant; or (2) a signed statement explaining why applicant should not be required to adopt a different trade name for use under WMATC authority. The email cautioned applicant that failure to timely furnish one or the other would result in delay or dismissal of the application. Applicant has produced neither the proof nor the statement.

Under the Compact, an application to obtain a certificate of authority shall be made in writing, verified, and shall contain the information required by the application form and accompanying instructions.¹ An applicant may be required to publish notice of the application in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District and furnish any supplemental information necessary for a full and fair determination of the application.² Failure to comply with the Commission's application requirements warrants dismissal.³

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED: that the application of OAC Enterprises LLC for a certificate of authority is hereby dismissed without prejudice for want of prosecution.
