By email dated October 26, 2018, applicant was notified of acceptance of its application for a certificate of authority and directed to furnish additional information no later than November 13, 2018, including a statement specifying the street address where applicant maintains its principal place of business or, alternatively, a copy of a lease for the street address listed in the application. The email cautioned applicant that failure to timely furnish the information would result in delay or dismissal of the application. Applicant's response did not include either of the aforementioned items.

Under the Compact, an application to obtain a certificate of authority shall be made in writing, verified, and shall contain the information required by the application form and accompanying instructions.<sup>1</sup> An applicant may be required to publish notice of the application in a newspaper of general circulation in the Metropolitan District and furnish any supplemental information necessary for a full and fair determination of the application.<sup>2</sup> Failure to comply with the Commission's application requirements warrants dismissal.<sup>3</sup>

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED: that the application of Anthony G Swaby, trading as Sway Elite Limo Services, for a certificate of authority is hereby dismissed without prejudice for want of prosecution.
