This matter is before the Commission on respondent's response to Order No. 21,523, served September 18, 2025.

I. BACKGROUND

The Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Regulation Compact¹ authorizes the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Commission (WMATC) to issue a certificate of passenger carrier authority if it finds that the proposed transportation is consistent with the public interest and that the applicant is fit, willing, and able to perform the proposed transportation properly, conform to the provisions of the Compact, and conform to the rules, regulations, and requirements of the Commission.²

The Commission may attach to the issuance of a certificate and to the exercise of the rights granted under it any term, condition, or limitation that is consistent with the public interest.³

The Commission approved the application of Precision Care Health Services, LLC, (respondent) for a certificate of authority in Order No. 21,113 on January 17, 2025, subject to fulfillment of several conditions within 180 days, including the condition that respondent produce a copy of the for-hire vehicle registration card for each vehicle to be operated under WMATC authority, as required by WMATC Regulation No. 64-04.⁴ Respondent did not fully satisfy the conditions of the grant within the allotted time, and the conditional grant consequently became void on July 17, 2025.

On July 21, 2025, respondent requested reconsideration of the voiding of its conditional grant of authority pursuant to Rule No. 27-06. Under Rule No. 26-05, in the event a conditional grant of authority becomes void, the Commission's Executive Director may reopen the

proceeding and issue said authority if the applicant timely files an application for reconsideration and satisfies the conditions of issuance on or before the deadline for requesting reconsideration. As of July 31, 2025, respondent had satisfied all conditions except the for-hire plate condition. In the absence of any passenger carrier authority, respondent was unable to obtain for-hire plates for its sole initial WMATC vehicle, a 2015 Honda with VIN ending 025289.

To resolve the impasse, the Commission reopened the application proceeding⁵ and issued WMATC Certificate No. 3922 to respondent on July 31, 2025, subject to a vehicle-out-of-service notice and subject to the proviso that respondent obtain for-hire plates for the 2015 Honda and submit a copy of the new registration to the Commission within 30 days or face revocation of Certificate No. 3922. As of September 18, 2025, respondent had yet to furnish proof of for-hire plates for the Honda.

Accordingly, Order No. 21,523 gave respondent 30 days to show cause why the Commission should not revoke Certificate No. 3922 for respondent's willful failure to satisfy all conditions attached to the issuance of said certificate.

II. RESPONSE AND ORDER TO TERMINATE PROCEEDING

On October 17, 2025, respondent produced a for-hire registration card for the 2015 Honda. Inasmuch as the Honda now has for-hire plates, respondent may place this vehicle into revenue service and we find that respondent has shown good cause for not revoking Certificate No. 3922.

Accordingly, this proceeding is hereby terminated.
