By application accepted for filing July 8, 1994, D&R Enterprises (D&R or applicant), a nonprofit corporation chartered in DC, seeks temporary authority to transport passengers in irregular route operations between points in the Metropolitan District, restricted to transportation in vehicles with a manufacturer's designed seating capacity of 15 or fewer persons, including the driver.

The application includes information regarding, among other things, applicant's corporate status, facilities, proposed tariff, finances, and regulatory compliance record. The application is available for inspection at the office of the Commission during its regular business hours.

Applicant proposes commencing operations with a 12-passenger van. Applicant's proposed tariff contains a lump-sum contract rate for transportation services to be provided to clients of the Blind & Visually Impaired Program at the Logan Adult Education Center, 3rd & G Streets, N.E., Washington, DC. The application is supported by a notarized affidavit from the Project Director of the program.

D&R also has applied for a certificate of authority, irregular route operations, in case no. AP-94-32.


According to the Compact, Title II, Article XI, Section 13(a), the Commission may grant temporary authority if it finds there is an immediate need for service that is not available. Under Commission Regulation No. 54-06(a), the Commission must further find that the applicant is fit to provide the temporary service proposed.

This order will provide notice of D&R's application for temporary authority as required by Commission Rule No. 6. A brief period of time will be permitted for the filing of protests. No extension of the protest period will be granted.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that any person wanting to protest the application, in accordance with Commission Rule No. 13 and Regulation No. 54-04(a), shall file such protest at the office of the Commission, 1828 L Street, N.W., Suite 703, Washington, DC 20036-5104, no later

than July 26, 1994, and shall simultaneously serve a copy of such protest on applicant's representative, Mr. Jerome L. Darden, President, D&R Enterprises, 322 H Street, N.E., Washington, DC 20002.
