This proceeding was initiated in Order No. 7360, served August 21, 2003, after the Commission received a copy of a \$1.5 million WMATC Certificate of Insurance and Policy Endorsement (WMATC Insurance Endorsement) in the name of Vincent C. Goins, T/A Jihad Properties. Mr. Goins is respondent's CEO. The record at that time indicated that Mr. Goins had not reported the vehicle identified in his policy to respondent's insurance company. "Normally, the WMATC Insurance Endorsement acts as a backstop since it provides coverage even in the event a vehicle is not identified in the policy, but the Endorsement is of little value if a claimant is not given accurate policy information."¹ Thus, until Mr. Goins reported both vehicles to the same insurer(s) and filed the corresponding WMATC Insurance Endorsement(s), the public would remain at risk.

Accordingly, Order No. 7360 revoked the WMATC Insurance Endorsements on file for respondent effective September 20, 2003,² and gave respondent thirty days to file the necessary replacement endorsement(s) and proof of having reported both respondent's vehicle and its CEO's vehicle to the underlying insurer(s). The order further stipulated that Certificate No. 597 would be automatically suspended under Regulation No. 58-02, and subject to revocation pursuant to Article XI, Section 10(c), of the Compact, if respondent failed to timely comply. Respondent failed to timely comply, and Certificate No. 597 was automatically suspended under Regulation No. 58-02 as a result, as noted in Order No. 7429, served September 29, 2003.

Order No. 7429 also noted that respondent's \$100 annual fee for 2003³ and annual report for 2002,⁴ both due January 31, 2003, were still outstanding.⁵


² Under Regulation No. 58-09, the Commission may, upon thirty (30) days' notice, revoke its approval of any WMATC Insurance Endorsement if, in the judgment of the Commission, such security does not comply with the Commission's regulations or for any reason fails to provide satisfactory or adequate protection for the public.

Respondent since has filed an acceptable \$1.5 million primary WMATC Insurance Endorsement and proof of having reported both respondent's vehicle and its CEO's vehicle to the underlying insurer. Further, respondent has paid its annual fee for 2003 and submitted its annual report for 2002. Accordingly, the suspension is lifted, and this investigation is terminated.
