Commission Regulation No. 58 requires respondent to insure the revenue vehicles operated under Certificate No. 463 for a minimum of \$5 million in combined-single-limit liability coverage and maintain on file with the Commission at all times proof of coverage in the form of a WMATC Certificate of Insurance and Policy Endorsement (WMATC Insurance Endorsement) for each policy comprising the minimum.

The \$1 million primary and \$4 million excess WMATC Insurance Endorsements on file for respondent terminated on June 11, 2004. No endorsement has been filed to replace the excess coverage, and a \$1 million endorsement filed on June 10, 2004, to replace the primary coverage is unacceptable for filing because the carrier address on the endorsement does not match the carrier address on file with the Commission.¹ Certificate No. 463, therefore, is automatically suspended under Regulation No. 58-02 and may be revoked if respondent does not replace the terminated coverage and file the necessary WMATC Insurance Endorsement(s) within thirty days.

THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED:

1. That respondent shall not transport passengers for hire under Certificate No. 463, unless and until otherwise ordered by the Commission.

2. That Certificate No. 463 shall be subject to revocation pursuant to Article XI, Section 10(c), of the Compact, if respondent fails to restore the full \$5 million minimum coverage and file the necessary WMATC Insurance Endorsement(s) within thirty days.
